Synopsis shall consist of the following in the same chronological order:

- a. Introduction
- b. Significance of the study
- c. Objectives of the study
- d. Scope and Limitation of the study
- e. Hypothesis or Research Questions
- f. Literature Review
- g. Research Methodology
- h. Scheme of the Study

Note:

- Non-adherence to the above structure will lead to the rejection of the synopsis
- Page Limit: 20 - 25 pages

GUIDELINES FOR DISSERTATION

The final dissertation shall consist of the following pattern in the mentioned chronological order:

- a. Chapter 1 – General Introduction
 - Introduction
 - Significance of the study
 - Objectives of the study
 - Scope and Limitation of the Study
 - Hypothesis or Research Questions
 - Research Methodology
 - Scheme of the Study
 - Literature Review
- b. Main Body, which may consist of 4 to 5 chapters excluding the first and last chapters.
- c. Last Chapter – Conclusion
 - Description of the conclusion
 - Findings of the Hypothesis or Research Questions
 - Suggestions
- d. Bibliography

- Note:
- Non-adherence to the above structure will lead to the rejection of the dissertation.
 - Page Limit: 100 - 150 page

OTHER GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. The synopsis/dissertation shall be in Times New Roman 12 Font with 1.5 spacing between the lines. The footnote shall be in Times New Roman 10 Font with 1.0 spacing between the lines.
2. Footnotes shall be arranged in the Blue Book method of citation 20th Edition. (For guidance refer to the format provided on the University website).
3. The dissertation shall be original and free from plagiarism. The student shall submit the anti-plagiarism report of the dissertation (generated by uploading the document on the Anti-plagiarism software procured by the University) duly signed by the allotted Research Supervisor at the time of the submission of the final dissertation to the office of the Controller of Examination.
4. The maximum percentage of plagiarism in the Anti-Plagiarism report shall not be more than 10%.
5. In case of any copyright violation, the concerned student will hold the liability.
6. If anything is borrowed from books, articles, etc. No portion should be borrowed from any work without acknowledging the source duly. The borrowed portion must appear within double inverted commas. If more than four sentences are borrowed that portion must appear in indented form.
7. Originality: The student must write with originality. Anti- Plagiarism software shall be run and a maximum of 10% of Plagiarism shall be permitted. A softcopy on CD must be submitted along with a hardcopy, without which submission shall not be counted as a valid submission.
8. The paper shall be evaluated for a total of 100 marks, out of which 70 marks shall be awarded for written submission and 30 marks shall be awarded for presentation.
9. The front pages of the dissertation shall consist of the following in the same chronological order:
 - a. Title Page
 - b. Undertaking from Candidate
 - c. Declaration
 - d. Certificate from Research Supervisor
 - e. Copyright Transfer Certificate
 - f. List of Contents (Nominal)
 - g. List of Contents (Detailed)
 - h. List of Abbreviations (A – Z in Ascending order)
 - i. List of case-laws (A – Z in Ascending order)
 - j. List of Tables or Charts
